SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN AND VULNERABLE ADULTS POLICY

Who is a vulnerable person?

Vulnerable persons could include:

- children under 18 years of age
- adults with learning difficulties or physical disability
- frail elderly people.

The importance of child protection is well known but we all owe a duty of care to all those using premises, equipment and facilities both indoor and outdoor in our village, which means that the safety of those who cannot read warning signs, who are frail or physically less able, needs to be borne in mind. Hart Parish Council fully recognises its responsibilities for child protection for children under the age of 18 and as such this policy is pertinent to the Council's role as operator of the Parish Council website and any facilities/activities provided by the Parish Council.

This policy applies to all staff, councillors, contractors and volunteers.

Principles

All members of Hart Parish Council have a duty to safeguard vulnerable users of village facilities and those who may come into contact with vulnerable users. They should respond to any concerns they may have regarding the physical, sexual, emotional or psychological safety of a vulnerable person or concerns relating to discriminatory or financial violation or exploitation of a vulnerable person.

This policy is in place to protect all vulnerable persons regardless of age, culture, disability, ethnicity, faith, gender, or sexuality.

Policy

- 1 No member of the Council will have unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults unless they have undertaken the checks required by law.
- 2 Any suspicions or allegations of abuse against a child or vulnerable person will be taken seriously and dealt with speedily.
- 3 The Council will, in exercising its statutory functions, ensure to the best of its ability that the welfare of the child or vulnerable adult is paramount and is the responsibility of everyone. All children and vulnerable adults, without exception, have the right to protection from abuse, whether physical, sexual or verbal, and from bullying, exclusion, physical violence or shouting. Racism or sexism towards children or vulnerable adults will not be tolerated.
- 4 All Councillors will be made aware of this policy.
- 5 The Council will ensure that young people and those who are vulnerable are welcome to Council meetings and will feel safe and secure in the environment.

Reporting Incidents

The nominated Child Protection and Vulnerable Adult representative is the Clerk. She will have responsibility for reporting **any** concerns that arise, as a matter of urgency, to Child and Adult Services.

The clerk will:
